

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Brothers and Sisters, Now is the time to come together. Now is the time to strive for Unity and unanimity. Now is the time to set aside any differences. Now is the time to work together for our common goal.

As most of you know, our current contract with our largest employer, Con Edison, expires in June. This means we will be negotiating a new contract.

If our past few contracts with Con Ed are any indicator, we'll be in for tough, tough talks. Management will come at us seeking to gut the current contract and take away past gains in any new agreement. We will go to them fighting to get you the wages you deserve and the benefits you need for yourselves and your families. We understand that times are tough right now, that it is a constant fight to keep up with rising costs; and we pledge that, with a unified membership, your Officers will bring that fight to the bargaining table.

Management will arrive at the table with unreasonable demands. They are used purposely as an intimidation tactic. They do it every time. It hasn't worked in the past and it will not work now. In 2012, those demands were management's excuse to lock us out. We weathered that attack and came out of it stronger and more dedicated to protecting and expanding benefits for our members.

Management will play endless games with us, trying to cause imbalance in our ranks, trying to turn you against your Union just when we need unity most. They will send people to the bargaining table without authority to make an agreement. They will send negotiators who think they are better, tougher, and smarter than we are. They will do almost anything but get down to real business as they try to frustrate our resolve by dilly-dallying. They will lose. They always do. Why do they always lose at their game? They lose because

we carry the biggest weapon we can, you, our Union Brothers and Sisters. You are what enables us to spend endless days at the table. We go into these sessions with a plan. We go in with experience .And most importantly, we go in with your strike authorization in hand.

In the next few weeks, your Union will be asking for that strike authorization. I cannot express too strongly that the closer we are to a unanimous strike vote, the stronger

hand we will have in securing a good, fair, decent contract for you and your families. Brothers and Sisters, this is the most vital action you can take to protect yourself, your families, and your Brother and Sister Members.

A strike authorization from you is the biggest stick in our arsenal. As President Teddy Roosevelt said, "Speak softly, and carry a big stick." That was his philosophy on foreign policy, but that is our policy when we sit down at the table to bargain a new contract.

Do not be mistaken. There is no pro forma way to conclude a bargaining agreement. We need all of you with us. Without your backing, in Unity, we will have no real strength. A strong strike authorization sends a message louder than a thunderclap. Management will sit up at attention. It's the only way to get them focused.

So, give your Union what it needs, and we'll take care of you. Come to the Membership Meeting. Your future is at stake!

A Message from Vice President William Smith

The call to Unity and Solidarity cannot be over emphasized.

President Shillitto outlined exactly what we have in front of us in the coming months, and his call to Unity and Solidarity cannot be over emphasized.

Local 1-2's Women's Caucus did a great job highlighting for their Sister and Brother Members all that they do for the Local, and on the job. As the

song lyric says, "Anything you can do, I can do better." They show it every day.

We have had successful Steward training over the past few months.

Never forget your Steward is your first line of defense when management tries to implement changes in your work, in violation of our bargaining agreement and the law. It happens all the time; and more frequently in the past 18 months. Your Steward is there to make common sense prevail; and if that doesn't work, to notify your

Business Agent. Your Union will not only make sure that a grievance is filed but – in most cases – that a charge is filed against management with the National Labor Relations Board.

In this Record we have the application for the Joseph Caradonna Memorial Scholarship for your sons and daughters who are currently high school seniors and will be continuing their educations. Remember, trade schools count, too.

It was gratifying to see how many Members bought a sports-branded t-shirt at the Membership Meeting in February. The proceeds went into our scholarship fund.

As one of the officers who bargains on your behalf, I'm looking forward to coming into summer with a contract in hand from Con Edison, on time. But we must prepare for all eventualities. It might put a bump in our summer plans for Local 1-2 gatherings, whether it's a

baseball night, a memorial golf outing or a Union picnic. We are confident that we

can secure a fair and decent contract for our Members; and all of our energies will be put into the effort

to do so.

Coming into our last Membership Meeting before summer and our break from regular Membership Meetings until September, it's vital that you try to be there on April 30. In person if you can, but your online presence is welcome as well.

Our Union is adding many new Members at the beginning of their careers who have many questions about Unions, Unionism and the great privilege of being a Member of Local 1-2. I suggest you seek answers from your Stewards or Business Agent for any concerns you have. Some of you will have the experience of approving a strike authorization for the first time, or if it becomes necessary participating in informational picketing, or being ready to take your place on the line if a strike is our only recourse.

Remember, apathy is lethal. The Boss is not your friend, we are. Unity!



JOSEPH CARADONNA SCHOLARSHIP FUND

JOSEPH CARADONNA SCHOLARSHIP FUND 2023 ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

College-bound children of current non-supervisory utilities workers based in New York City or Westchester County are eligible to compete for grants under the Joseph Caradonna Memorial Scholarship. The program provides scholarship grants, to be used toward the payment of college tuition and books.

To qualify as a candidate, a student must be a child of a Utility Worker, who is not a supervisor nor in management, based in New York City or Westchester County and must be a High School Senior graduating in 2024. The scholarship will be paid only to those who have declared their intention to enroll or are already enrolled in a post-high school institution certified by the Department of Education in the state where the institution is located.

Applications (see the following page) must be completed and mailed to:

All applications must be accompanied by a copy of the official transcript of high school grades covering the first six terms.

To meet the deadline for filing, your application MUST BE POSTMARKED no later than June 30, 2024.

After the initial application step, the Scholarship candidates will be required to write an essay of 350 words or more and forward it to the Scholarship Fund office on a date to be announced. The topic of the essay will involve the importance of a Union in the life of the applicant's family, with the specific topic each year revealed in a letter or email sent to each student competing for the Scholarships.

Utility workers themselves, their spouses and their siblings are excluded from participating in the contest, as are the children of full-time Union Officers. The winners will be chosen by the Trustees based on the students' school transcript records and the written essays.

Winners will be notified by mail or email in or before late August and will receive their scholarships at the UWUA Local 1-2 General Membership Meeting held in the Fall of 2024.

The deadline is quickly approaching; so if you want your child to apply for the Scholarship in 2024, please have your child complete the application, get a copy of his/her high school transcript and send in the material as soon as possible.
